Placement Test Study Outline

Please use this outline as a guide in your study preparation when applying to the Advanced Standing Alternative for Graduate Practical Nurses Program at WCC. This will help you focus on the areas you are likely to see on the placement test. To be eligible to enter the program, you must make at least a 78 on the placement test. There are 100 questions on the test. Applicants may take the test twice per year (application period). The test establishes your knowledge of nursing fundamentals, pharmacology, and dosage calculations. The test is computer-based and administered in the Wayne Learning Center Testing Center. You will have 110 minutes to take the test. Before testing, please contact the Wayne Learning Center Testing Center (WLC Room 216A) at 919-739-6747 concerning times, days of availability, and testing procedures. Remember to bring a photo ID with you to the testing center. You may use a basic calculator and be provided a blank sheet of paper. In addition, you will need to provide a pencil. No other resources are allowed during the test. After completing the test, you will receive your grade. Do not discuss the content of the test with anyone. Applicants that do not follow the academic integrity standard will be disqualified from admission into the program.
